The Erin Mills Soccer Club is also known as EMSC and Home of the Eagles. The Clubhouse features a 20,000 square foot indoor soccer facility. EMSC has over 1,500 members and 200 professional coaches and volunteers. The Erin Mills Soccer Club carries the Gold Standard Award for Club Excellence from Ontario Soccer. EMSC's tradition of excellence includes six national championships (6 Gold & 4 Silver) and 53 Ontario Cup winners (Outdoor, Indoor and Futsal). There are former EMSC players competing in the MLS, NCAA, CIS, Provincial and National levels. Over EMSC's 51-year history, several hundred players have earned scholarships with universities and colleges in Canada and the United States. ESMC is committed to develop, teach, and promote soccer to all ages, at all levels of play, in a safe and healthy environment.



A huge feather in the club's cap was gaining its national licensing. The club gained the status of Quality Service Provider. The Quality Service Providers (QSP) is the entry-level category in Canada Soccer's Club Licensing Program.

To qualify as a QSP, member organizations must provide a developmentally appropriate, safe, enjoyable, accessible, inclusive and welcoming playing environment for their participants, differentiating it from non-member soccer and unorganized play. QSPs must also be in good standing with their governing organization(s) and meet the expectations of membership. Next year, we will look to apply for our Member Association level 1.



2023 was brimming with fantastic experiences; we were fortuitous enough to have lots of success in both streams: girls and boys.

Collectively, we went to over 30 tournaments/showcases. In addition to our athletes gaining great exposure, we accomplished the following:

Girls 2007 White 1st place from YPHDL Premier Division (GHSL promotion)

Girls 2007 Green 2nd place from TOSL 1st Tier

Girls 2006 Green 1st place from GHSL Elite Division

Girls 2010 Green 1st place from YPHDL Premier Division (Co-Winner; possible GHSL promotion)

Boys 2010 Green 1st place from YPHDL Premier Division (Co-Winner; possible GHSL promotion)

Girls 2009 Black 2nd Place YPHDL League Cup Girls 2007 Black 2nd Place YPHDL League Cup









We also linked up with Team Town Sports, who did a photoshoot and advert with one of our teams.

Educationally we also continued on and off the field for our athletes. We had many guest speakers and guest coaches at our practices and seminars. Notably, we made strong links with key organizations that specialize in assisting athletes with their next moves in their sporting careers.

To assist in getting our athletes the top exposure needed, we linked up with FTF (First Touch Football). FTF Canada is a digital media company that focuses on exposure and opportunities for Canadian Soccer players and organizations. They host nationally recognized events/combines all year around, allowing players to showcase their skills in front of a wider audience.

Off the field, we sought out the expertise of Best Education Preparation, who are education specialists. Best Ed Prep offer tutoring and test preparation to help get athletes to where they want to be. They help ensure that no stone is unturned academically, whether our players are looking to go to school in Canada or the United States.

Also, off the field, we reunited with the 'Back2Play' concussion awareness team. The team offered interactive concussion awareness education workshops for our membership, including coaches, players, and parents. Education like this aims to make the pitch a safer space with so much awareness and knowledge on the subject. The education continued for the coaches as many coaches started and completed various licensing.

To aid with the learning process, the club doubled its VEO cameras. Having the ability to film twice as many games and break each one down afterward will undoubtedly be an added bonus for our athletes, assisting with the overall understanding of the game.

Following on from last year's momentous victory at the Club, where we started our female mentorship program, 'She's an Eagle.' The program completed a full year with ten female leaders fully ready to begin their coaching adventures. Round two has just started, we aim to make it the biggest female mentorship program in the province, and we are taking steps towards that one day at a time.

One of the challenges we faced was like last year's in that we were stretched at times to keep up with the program's growth. Another challenge was space. With soccer and other sports all growing, we faced difficulties renting multisport spaces, especially in the winter, when the turf fields were scarce. We want to be able to offer new programs, but at times, must grapple for space, in addition to staffing and funding the new ventures.

Overall, the year has built on last year's success, and we are excited to see what the future holds at the Club. We want to make sure that we are staying current and offering the highest possible program standards that we can obtain.

A final thought for our membership is to believe in the process, and good things will happen...



Development Report 2023

2023 proved to be another successful year for the development program. Our focus was to raise standards. We recognised areas that needed improvement and really homed in on cultivating a program that was of high quality.

Our program is much more than a numbers game. Our primary goal is always to improve lives on and off the pitch. For us to have that impact however, we must ensure we are consistently driving revenue into the club. By the end of the 2023 summer season, we had significantly overachieved, hitting budget and subsequent targets thereafter. We rounded off the season with well over 200 children in the program and over 20 teams. Part of our objective is to give as many kids as possible the opportunity to play the game we all love. We will continue to offer barrier free opportunities to our community going forward.

Below are some ways in which we excelled on both the playing and coaching side of the program during 2023. At EMSC we are continually striving to raise standards. If we wish to be recognised as one of the premier clubs in the area, it's vitally important that continue to innovate going forward.

Player experience

Speaking from experience, soccer can have such a huge impact on a child's life. If correctly organised, a club can provide a space where players can be safe, have fun and make friends for life. Whilst it would be amazing to see our Eagles play at a high level in the future, this is not our primary objective. In 2023 we offered so much more than just training and games. Below is a breakdown of how we as a club provided a fantastic experience for our players.

- Tournaments- All of our teams played in tournaments this past year, these occasions
 are brilliant for our teams as they allow our kids to get out of their comfort zone and bond
 with their teammates in a unique way. Most notably, the entire grassroots program
 participated in the prestigious Robbie Festival. I've no doubt that long lasting memories
 were created by all those who participated.
- Non soccer activities- As a club we paid for all of our teams to go bowling. Having
 witnessed some of these days, I can safely say they were enjoyed by all! We also
 provided use of our clubhouse to teams who wished to host end of season celebrations.
 Our sports coordinator, Chris, also organised mini golf for our players in the summer.
- **VEO analysis sessions** Our VEO lead, Mo provided excellent analysis sessions for all our teams during the past year. These opportunities allowed our players to gain a deeper understanding of their roles and responsibilities both as individuals and a team.



- Concussion awareness- Once again we hosted the back2play concussion awareness team at the clubhouse. These days are always invaluable. Our teams learnt about a serious topic in a fun and informative way.
- Festival hosting- During the outdoor season we opted to host fixtures every single
 weekend. Whilst this is a big outlay for the club, we understand the value in our teams
 playing games locally and not having to travel to other areas. EMSC are one of the very
 few clubs that took on this responsibility. A massive thanks to our festival staff who made
 this a seamless process.

Coaching team development

As a club we would be nothing without our dedicated coaching staff. Our coaches act as role models for our players and have such a vital role in their lives. We recognise that development is equally as important for our coaches as it is to our players. This past year we have placed a real emphasis on providing the tools for our coaching team to be successful. Below are Just some of the ways we have achieved this.


- Coach meetings- In 2023 we hosted various coach meetings. These sessions placed
 emphasis on creating a successful culture, session planning, managing parental
 expectations and VEO tutorials. It was during one of these meetings that the coaches
 created their own set of expectations, this has proved to be a particularly beneficial
 exercise.
- Qualifications- We continued to place importance on education. As a club we paid for all of our coaching team to complete an array of courses. It was amazing to see our ambitious team take on these challenges and be rewarded with certificates. During 2023 we also hosted C license tutor, Darren Tilley, who gave an excellent presentation for our coaches on the C license process. All our coaches gained their community badges along with 4 C license graduates.
- Check in- During the past year we sat down with each coach individually. We went over their strengths and identified areas of improvement. These sessions proved to be valuable, and improvements were evident.
- **Game day evaluations-** We developed and implemented a new document which tracked various key standards that we want our coaches to maintain. Our coaches set the standard for the players and as such this tool has aided our ambition.
- Tools for success- We ensured our staff were fully equipped with the tools they needed to succeed. All coaches were given new tactics boards, access to our VEO subscription and weekly session plans.

Looking ahead to 2024

As we move into 2024 it's time to reassess our goals and look for ways to improve. One of our primary aims is to increase the number of female players in the club. The next cohort of our successful female mentorship program, 'She's an eagle' will begin their journey in January. We have also just launched a new girl only program 'Girl Power'. We will be looking to work with local stakeholders as well as schools to boost the female side of our program. In 2024 we must look at ways to attract quality coaches. We want EMSC to be a desirable place to work, to achieve this, we must continually strive to add to value to our coaching package. In early 2024 we are hosting a first aid course at the clubhouse. We will also be providing all our coaches with tickets to the upcoming Ontario Soccer Summit.




Recreational Report - 2023

This report will detail our outdoor and indoor recreational programs and provide participant numbers and revenue generated. We will also discuss some challenges faced this year and look ahead to the 2024 season.

2022 Fall Indoor Recreational Programs

With the covid pandemic now behind us we were able to get our recreational fall league numbers back to normal. We had 382 participants and generated \$92,659.75 worth of revenue.




Both the Eagles Soccer School and Ball Mastery programs were very successful as we had 108 total participants which generated \$20,977 worth of revenue.

2023 Winter Indoor Recreational Programs

Our numbers continued to increase in the winter season, we had 402 participants and generated \$96,907.11 worth of revenue.








We also had a small increase in both the Eagles Soccer School and Ball Mastery programs for the winter, we had 112 total registrants which generated \$23,260 in revenue.

2023 Spring & Summer Recreational Programs

With the growing success of both the Eagles Soccer School and Ball Mastery we decided to offer the program during the spring to bridge the gap between the end of the winter and the start of the summer season. We had 104 participants, and this generated \$22,445 in revenue.

We had a great 2023 Summer Recreational League with 1,116 participants joining us and that generated \$320,806 in revenue.





The Summer Eagles Soccer School and Ball Mastery had 66 participants and generated \$14,290 in revenue.

Challenges

One of the major challenges we had to start the summer season was getting committed volunteer coaches for our recreational league. Many of the coaches were high school students and they needed support for the first few weeks. We communicated expectations and responsibilities to the volunteers, and we saw an improvement later in the season.

We will continue to look for new ways to improve the quality of our volunteers by providing coaching clinics and training sessions to equip volunteers with the skills and knowledge they need. This can make potential coaches feel more confident and prepared for the role.

Looking Ahead to 2024:

We look forward to continuing to grow our numbers and increase our program's quality in the coming year. We have recently started to work with a few schools in the area and attended some fairs and events to promote our league and to recruit volunteers.

Our participants' feedback is important to us, and we will look at conducting surveys throughout the season to see what improvements can be made to better improve the overall experience.







Facility Report

Overview



Our competitive and development teams used the turf and futsal fields throughout the indoor season for practices and to host friendly games against other clubs. The fall and winter recreational program continued to use both fields on weekends to operate the league.

Highlights

In the past year our facility has seen a large increase in bookings for birthday parties and other social events which has helped generate revenue for the club. This has been a positive trend and shows that we are becoming a hub not only for soccer activities but also for social events. This diversification can contribute to the overall sustainability and success of the facility.

All our long-term rentals continue to book with us year after year, which is great to see and is not only a positive financial indicator but also a testament to the strong relationships our club has built in the community.

Challenges

One major challenge we faced during this past year was scheduling and optimizing the utilization of our facility. We offered flexible booking options and advised customers about our peak and off-peak pricing to incentivize bookings during less busy periods. We regularly updated and maintained the online booking schedule to reflect any changes.

With the increase in bookings for birthday parties and other social events we have had to make upgrades to the facility to enhance the overall experience for our customers. This included replacing the netting outside the turf field and painting the benches and other areas near the turf field. We have also purchased new chairs and tables for our party room and will continue to make upgrades going forward.

Looking Ahead to 2024

Significant changes will be taking place at the clubhouse this upcoming year. Our existing lease for both units will conclude and due to a substantial rent increase in the new lease we will only retain unit number four. This unit has all the staff offices and futsal field, we will no longer have the turf field going forward.

There will be some renovations taking place throughout the summer to make sure we are ready to welcome back our members for the fall and winter seasons. We plan to continue to use the clubhouse for our programs and facility rentals.






Introduction

We noticed mobile access constituted 70% of total visitors, underscoring the need for precise mobile optimization. We also saw increased traffic through many different source's notable google. We had a big emphasis on marketing diversification and did this successfully through leveraging different digital platforms. Moving forward, to sustain success, ongoing enhancements in mobile optimization and user experience are crucial.

Social Media

Notably, our Instagram followers increased from 2,384 in May to the current count of 2,805, marking a substantial growth of approximately 400 followers in just 7 months. Following the ceremony, we extended the festivities with food and entertainment options accessible to all our members. 
